Lifeskills for Year 7-9 at Key Stage 3



What will your pupils learn about?

Learning Objectives:

- ▶ To recognise danger
- ▶ To assess risk
- ▶ To make things safer
- ▶ To know what to do in an emergency
- ▶ To deal with peer pressure

Delivered in partnership with Birmingham School of Acting, visitors experience some powerful acted scenarios and workshop style discussions in some of our scenarios. Other

scenarios are delivered by our own Presenter Team. All challenge young people to think about some crucial issues around personal safety and responsibility, covering

significant sections of the PSHE curriculum at KS3, including peer pressure, drugs and alcohol, road safety, water safety consequences of crime and much more.

Visit arrangements

A short introduction is held with up to 60 pupils after which they are divided into smaller groups. After experiencing both the acted scenarios and those delivered by our presenters, an interactive

quiz takes place to assess and consolidate learning. The whole visit lasts around 2 hours.

Due to availability of actors, Lifeskills is only available on

Tuesdays from November until Easter. The NGAGE programme, delivered by our Presenter team, covers very similar ground - see opposite.
